THE QUEEN'S HEALTH SYSTEMS EMPLOYEES DONATE MORE THAN \$83,000 TO THE HAWAII FOODBANK

HONOLULU – In an effort to help meet Hawaii's hunger needs, employees of The Queen's Health Systems (QHS) donated a total of \$83,035.37 to the Hawaii Foodbank which will help provide more than 207,000 meals.

The initiative was launched by The Queen's Medical Group's Culture & Wellness Committee as a way of easing the suffering caused by the COVID-19 pandemic. During the height of the pandemic, the QHS 'ohana was deeply touched by the amount of love and support we received from the community. This is an opportunity for us to say mahalo to the community.
